TAKES THREE MORE CITIES Taliban sweeps across Southern Afghanistan

The insurgents have taken more than a dozen provincial capitals in the recent days

KABUL: The Taliban have captured another three provincial capitals in southern Afghanistan, including in Helmand, the scene of some of the heaviest fighting in the past two decades, as the insurgents press a lightning offensive that is gradually encircling the capital, Kabul. The loss of Helmand's provincial capital comes after years of toil and blood spilled by American, British and allied



fighting and raised their white flag over governmental installations. He says that three national army bases outside of Lashkar Gah remain under control of the government.

Atta Jan Haqbayan, the provincial council chief in Zabul province, said the local capital of Qalat fell to the Taliban and that officials are in a nearby army camp preparing to leave. Two lawmakers from Afghanistan's southern Uruzgan province said local officials have surrendered the provincial capital, Tirin Kot, to the rapidly advancing Taliban. Bismillah Jan Mohammad and Qudratullah Rahimi confirmed the surrender Friday. Mohammad says the governor is en route to the airport to depart for Kabul. The latest advances came hours after the insurgents captured the country's second and third largest cities in a lightning advance. The seizures of Kandahar and Herat mark the biggest prizes yet for the Taliban. While Kabul isn't directly under threat yet, the losses and the battles elsewhere further tighten the grip of a resurgent Taliban, who are estimated to now hold over two-thirds of the country and continue to press their offensive. China rejects WHO call for renewed probe into origin

BEIJING: China on Friday rejected the World Health Organization's calls for a renewed probe into the origins of COVID-19, saying it supported "scientific" over "political" efforts to find out how the virus started. Pressure is once more mounting on Beijing to consider a fresh probe into the origins of a pandemic which has killed more than four million people and paralysed economies worldwide since it first emerged in the central Chinese city of Wuhan, DW reported.

A delayed and heavily politicised visit by a WHO team of international experts went to Wuhan in January 2021 to produce a first phase report, which was written in conjunction with their Chinese counterparts. It failed to conclude how the virus began. On Thursday the WHO urged China to share raw data from the earliest COVID-19 cases to revive its probe into the origins of the disease. China hit back, Vice Foreign Minister Ma Zhaoxian saying it has never rejected cooperation on tracing the origins of COVID-19, but rejects the politicisation of such a search, state media reported. "We oppose political tracing ... and abandoning the joint report" issued after the WHO team's Wuhan visit, Ma told reporters. "We support scientific tracing." The joint report said the virus jumping from bats to humans via an intermediate animal was the most probable scenario, while a leak from Wuhan's virology labs was "extremely unlikely." Ma rejected suggestions of new lines of investigation. AGENCIES

Delta variant of COVID-19 spreading fast in Lanka

COLOMBO: The highly transmissible Delta variant of the Coronavirus is spreading rapidly across Sri Lanka and comprise around 75 per cent of the new cases reported in the Western province, experts said, warning that the island nation was facing its most decisive fortnight in its fight against the pandemic. There has been a rise in the number of deaths and new COVID-19 infections driven in large part by the highly infectious Delta variant. Dr Chandima Jeewandara of the University of Sri Jayewardenapura said by early this month, 75 per cent of the new infections detected in the Western province were carrying the Delta variant and the island is bracing to face its most decisive fortnight. Now we are reaching the sixth week of its effect. Unlike the other variants, this is different. We know that the number of deaths are ever increasing, yesterday it crossed 150, Jeewandara said. On Wednesday, 156 deaths were recorded, the highest single-day number with over 3,000 new infections also being reported. Sri Lanka is fighting the third wave of Coronavirus. The first five cases of the Delta variant detected came from Colombo on June 17. Jeewandara said the number of asymptomatic cases are also on the rise. The Sri Lankan government has resisted calls from medical professionals to go for a total lockdown. The government's policy is to increase vaccination and keep the country open to allow economic activity. The government said that around 95 per cent of the over 30 population have been given at least one jab. The under 30s are also to be vaccinated soon. If the current spread was not contained the third wave may take around 20,000 lives by the year-end, some experts have warned. They say the island's health facilities have been overwhelmed already with the rising number of cases. AGENCIES
