World leaders gather in Egypt to talk climate amid many distractions

SHARM EL-SHEIKH: The head of the United Nations warned Monday that the world is on a "highway to climate hell with our foot on the accelerator" unless drastic action is taken to curb global warming. UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres told world leaders gathered for this year's climate summit in Egypt said humanity must "cooperate or perish," saying rich industrial nations must lead the way. But Guterres said emerging economies must also do their bit to bend the global emissions curve, calling out the world's two biggest emitters, the United States and China, have a particular responsibility. The UN urged countries to forge a "climate solidarity pact" that includes giving poor countries sufficient financial support to cope with the effects of global warming, and reiterated his call for a tax on the windfall profits of fossil fuel companies. Egyptian President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi warned that "the planet has become a world of suffering" in his opening remarks to leaders at the summit. "Climate change will never stop without our intervention... Our time here is limited and

we must use every second that we have," he said. El-Sisi also called for an end to the Russia-Ukraine war. Ghana's President Nana Akufo-Addo called for wealthy nations who are more responsible for climate change to pay and compensate African nations that are among the

hardest hit by the impacts of climate change. "The damage is obvious," he told The Associated Press on Monday. "Those who are responsible should be very, very much aware of the need to compensate others." He said his government needs around 561 billion to

implement the country's transition plan to clean energy, and at the same time avoid job losses in the oil and gas sector. The World Trade Organisation chief is acknowledging that trade contributes to carbon emissions but says a new WTO report estimates that lifting tariffs and other barriers to trade in environmentally friendly energy products could both boost exports and reduce emissions. WTO Director-General Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala says the Geneva-based trade body's latest World Trade Report, whose release was timed for Monday's opening of the UN climate conference, found that trade has helped prices of solar electricity to plunge 97 per cent since 1990. However, trade, like most economic activities, emits greenhouse gases and CO2 emissions linked to international goods and services exports accounted for 30% of global carbon emissions as of 2018, the report said. Missile tests were practice to attack South, US: N Korea

SEOUL: North Korea's military said on Monday its recent barrage of missile tests were practices to "mercilessly" strike key South Korean and US targets such as air bases and operation command systems with a variety of missiles that likely included nuclear-capable weapons. The North's announcement underscored leader Kim Jong Un's determination not to back down in the face of his rivals' push to expand their military exercises. But some experts say Kim also used their drills as an excuse to modernise his nuclear arsenal and increase his leverage in future dealings with Washington and Seoul. North Korea fired dozens of missiles and flew warplanes toward the sea last week triggering evacuation alerts in some South Korean and Japanese areas in protest of massive US-South Korean air force drills that the North views as an invasion rehearsal. US and South Korea officials responded they would further enhance their joint training events and warned the North that the use of nuclear weapons would result in the end of Kim's regime. "The recent corresponding military operations by the Korean People's Army are a clear answer of (North Korea) that the more persistently the

enemies' provocative military moves continue, the more thoroughly and mercilessly the KPA will counter them," the General Staff of North Korea's military said in a statement carried by state media. It said the weapons tests involved ballistic missiles loaded with dispersion warheads and underground infiltration warheads meant to launch strikes on enemy air bases; ground-to-air missiles designed to "annihilate" enemy aircraft at different altitudes and distances; and strategic cruise missiles that fell in international waters about 80 kilometres (50 miles) off South Korea's southeastern coastal city of Ulsan. The North's military said it also carried out an important test of a ballistic missile with a special functional warhead missioned with "paralysing the operation command system of the enemy." Imran's party to resume march on Wednesday

LAHORE: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf's long march, which was suspended after the failed assassination attempt on party chief Imran Khan last week, will resume on Wednesday instead of Tuesday, senior party leader Fawad Chaudhry said on Monday. Chaudhry, former information minister and Senior Vice President of the party, made the announcement in a tweet in which he said the party's long march will resume on Wednesday instead of Tuesday at 2pm local time. Earlier, former foreign minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi said that the long march would resume on Tuesday from the same location where the attack on party chief Imran Khan took place. During a press conference in Lahore, Qureshi said that the move sent a clear message to party workers and the nation that the march would continue on its journey until "haqeeqi azadi (real freedom) is obtained". Qureshi said that Khan, who is currently recovering from his injuries, would give speeches via video link as the march moves onward. Khan was discharged from the hospital on Sunday after undergoing successful surgery. He has now been moved to a private residence in Lahore. AGENCIES

China says done 'utmost' to stabilise Pak's weak economy

BEIJING: China, which has offered a \$9 billion bailout package to Pakistan, on Monday pledged more support for the cash-strapped nation, saying that it has done its "utmost" to stabilise the financial situation of its all-weather ally and will continue to do so. Pakistan had been engaging with China and Saudi Arabia for financial support, including rolling over maturing loans as part of arrangements for about \$35 billion putouts against debt and liabilities during the current fiscal year. Pakistan's Finance Minister Ishaq Dar on Saturday last said that Islamabad would be getting about \$9 billion from China and \$4 billion from Saudi as the government tries to steady the nation's weak economy. Quoting Xi Jinping, Dar said the Chinese President in his meeting with Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif during his recent visit to Beijing on November 3 had assured him, "don't worry, we will not let you down". Replying to a query on his reactions to Dar's assertions, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Zhao Lijian told a media briefing here, "China has done its utmost to help Pakistan stabilise its financial situation. We have been doing so, and we will continue to do so." Zhao declined to comment on the current political crisis in Pakistan following the failed assassination attempt on

former prime minister Imran Khan, saying, "China has noted relevant reports. We express our sympathies to Imran Khan and wish him a speedy recovery". Khan, 70, suffered bullet injuries in the right leg when two gunmen fired a volley of bullets at him and others mounting on a container-mounted truck in the Wazirabad area of Pakistan's Punjab province where he was leading a long march against the Shehbaz-led government. The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party chairman underwent surgery for bullet injuries at the Shaukat Khanum Hospital in Lahore and was discharged on Sunday. Pakistan owes Paris Club countries a combined sum of around \$10.7 billion. The Paris Club is a group of officials from

major creditor nations whose role is to find coordinated and sustainable solutions to the payment difficulties experienced by debtor countries. According to the International Monetary Fund (IMF), Pakistan's total non-Paris Club bilateral debt currently stands at about \$27 billion, of which Chinese debt is about \$23 billion. During Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz's visit to Beijing, the Chinese leadership promised to roll over \$4 billion in sovereign loans, refinance \$3.3 billion commercial bank loans and increase currency swap by about \$1.45 billion. Sharif was among the first foreign leaders to visit China. AGENCIES
